GDPR for business (Part 1)

This module examines the obligations that the Data controller, and consequently his employees, must implement in the company, to develop best practices aimed at guaranteeing the protection of personal data (awareness, information, periodic training). Data protection is a business matter that must be handled on a day-to-day basis.

GDPR for business (Part 2)	This module contains, step by step, the complete path that all subjects who process personal data in their business must take to be compliant, so that "being compliant" becomes part of the business strategy.	v.1.0
The importance of risk management	Company risk management and privacy risk management are closely related. Privacy risk assessment and management must become part of the company's risk assessment. This module is a description of the potential steps in a risk assessment, also considering the requirements of the GDPR	v.1.O
Brief summary on cross-border processing and data transfer Extra EU	This module provides the instruments necessary to carry out cross-border data processing (outside Italy but within the EU) and those OUTSIDE the EU, which, as a rule, are considered highly dangerous and therefore prohibited, except in cases explicitly provided for by the GDPR.	v.1.0
Data Breach	This module provides practical information on what is a "Data breach" and how to deal with it	v.1.0

★ HOW TO ACCESS

The user can access the platform by entering his/her login details (email and password or username and password).

★ ACTIVITY TRACKING METHOD

The training platform is provided with the LMS management system, able to monitor and certify:

- The performance and completion of each user's activities;
- The traceability of each activity carried out during connection to the system, and its duration;
- The user's presence;
- The traceability of the individual teaching units, structured in Learning Object, which contains a series of tools, such as the text of the lessons, records explaining the topic, in-depth documents, short sample videos, and animations;
- The results of exams.

The traceability of platform data, user accesses, and certificates is kept by the platform within the terms established by law.

★ ASSESSMENT METHOD

each assessment is carried out through a final exam aimed at strengthening the knowledge acquired during the entire course. The exam consists of 15 T/F questions. The final exam is passed if at least 80% of the questions are answered correctly.
